Support Levels & Tiers

There are seven supports needs levels for <u>adults</u> determined by Supports Intensity Scale and Supplemental Questions and four reimbursement tiers. A number of services (group home, sponsored residential, supported living, independent living supports, group day, community engagement, and group supported employment) will be reimbursed according to these tiers. This process provides greater reimbursement for smaller settings and for supporting individuals with more intensive needs.

Reimbursement		Mild Support Needs
Tier 1		Individuals have some need for support, including little to no support need for medical and behavioral challenges. They can manage many aspects of their lives independently or with little assistance.
Reimbursement Tier 2	2 LEVEL	Moderate Support Needs Individuals have modest or moderate support needs, but little to no need for medical and behavioral supports. They need more support than those in Level 1, but may have minimal needs in some life areas.
Reimbursement Tier 3		Mild/Moderate Support Needs with Some Behavioral Support Needs Individuals have little to moderate support needs as in Levels 1 and 2. They also have an increased, but not significant, support needed due to behavioral challenges.
	4 LEVEL	Moderate to High Support Needs Individuals have moderate to high need for support. They may have behavioral support needs that are not significant but range from none to above average.
Reimbursement Tier 4	5 LEVEL	High to Moderate Support Needs Individuals have high to maximum personal care and/or medical support needs. They may have behavioral support needs that are not significant but range from none to above average.
	6 LEVEL	Intensive Medical Support Needs Individuals have intensive need for medical support but also may have similar support needs to individuals in Level 5. They may have some need for support due to behavior that is not significant.
	2	Intensive Behavioral Support Needs Individuals have intensive behavioral challenges, regardless of their support needs to complete daily activities or for medical conditions. These adults typically need significantly enhanced supports due to behavior.
